The school offers GED preparation, a pre-apprenticeship program, and court mediation services. The school's vision is:

We will raise the standard of living for all people by helping "at risk" students function as effective employees and citizens in our society. We will do this by providing an environment where attitudes can change and physical, addressing the bv spiritual, emotional, and mental needs of the total person without regard for race, creed, or color. We will train and equip our students so that they will be able to attain credentials in secondary education and continue on to function at their highest levels of achievement!
